Holocaust One-Page Research Project

Overview:

In this project, students will choose one Holocaust-related topic to research. They will take notes using credible sources and seek to answer basic research questions: who, what, when, where, why, and how. Then, they will visually lay out key information about their topic on a single page.

Project Steps:

STEP 1: Choose a topic

• Students will select a specific Holocaust-related topic to research.

STEP 2: Research

- Students will research their topics and take notes about the most important information.
- While researching, students will be sure to only use credible sources.
 Students will use at least two sources which will be recorded in the note-taking process.
- Research should give a broad but meaningful overview of the topic. Students notes' should be able to explain the who, what, when, where, why, and how of their topics.

STEP 3: Create a One-pager

- Students will analyze and interpret their research findings and determine which information is the most significant.
- They will present their information by creating a one-pager (using a template or from scratch) that visually groups information and presents it in a meaningful and visually appealing way to the audience.

Assessment Requirements:

- Thorough research on the topic: answers the questions who, what, when, where, why, and how
- At least 2 credible sources
- Accurate and meaningful information
- Visually appealing final product
